

NPPD Now Provides Labor and Economic Data Faster and in Greater Local Detail

Nebraska Public Power District (NPPD) might have found a timely solution to your needs. NPPD's Economic Development team recently began using the services of Economic Modeling Specialists International (EMSI). The information obtained from EMSI has been especially helpful in responding to requests for information about local labor availability and wage rates. Labor market information is pulled from more than 90 sources and is readily available through EMSI. Statistics can be provided at various levels such as zip code, city, county, multiple counties, and circular radii from a specific location.

Ken Lemke, Ph.D., NPPD Economist, states, **“while this type of information is generally available, it typically must be sourced from a variety of websites and databases. We conducted a thorough evaluation of vendors who aggregate this type of data, and based upon that assessment and needs of our customers defined through a survey, NPPD selected EMSI as its provider.”**

Pure Distillers Grains...Pure High Protein

The Nebraska Distillers Products (NDP) plant, located in Valley County, Nebraska, went into production in December 2015. NDP uses licensed patented technology to utilize a raw product of wet, modified, or dried distillers grains and then by using the equipment and processes, converts the raw product (distillers grains) into compressed forms for feeding applications to livestock in the shape of cubes, pellets, and tubs. No other additives or “material binders” are compressed into the end use product resulting in pure, high protein, high energy livestock feed.

NDP’s 44,000-square-foot building is located adjacent to the Green Plains Ord, LLC ethanol facility where they lease the land from Valley County Economic Development. To date, nine employees have been hired and that number is expected to grow. **“We are so pleased that NDP’s investors allowed us the opportunity to participate in this project and I appreciate the tremendous investment that their company has made in Ord and Valley County,”** said Trevor Lee, Executive Director of Valley County Economic Development.

Searching for a location? How about Nebraska?

Whether you are looking for a location to start a new business or have plans to expand your business, why not consider Nebraska?

Nearly 40 Nebraska communities have earned designation as a Nebraska Economic Development Certified Community, exemplifying development readiness.

The Nebraska Economic Development Certified Community (EDCC) program, sponsored by the Nebraska Diplomats, is one of a few nationally that recognize communities' economic development preparedness. The Nebraska Department of Economic Development (DED) administers the application process.

The certification process is ongoing and noncompetitive. Nebraska communities that exhibit the required documented economic development readiness as defined in the program criteria, and approved by a review committee, will earn certification. Each applicant community is evaluated on program standards related to their community's organization, community identified targets and/or markets, community infrastructure, local financing and business assistance, and existing sites and/or building information. Certification is effective for a five-year period, at which time, communities can apply for recertification.



RBDG Funding Supports Rural Nebraska

Twin Cities Development (TCD) Association in Scottsbluff, Nebraska, received funding through the Rural Business Development Grant (RBDG) program to create a community commercial kitchen. The \$45,000 grant will be matched with an additional \$16,500 from TCD for a total project of \$61,500. The funding will also provide technical assistance to food-based business entrepreneurs.

The commercial kitchen will allow local food businesses the space to develop their products and access to targeted technical assistance. These businesses will be able to expand beyond the local farmers markets by being able to introduce their products into larger markets such as grocery stores, restaurants, and other retail outlets.

Executive Director of Twin Cities Development Association Rawnda Pierce indicated the commercial kitchen will be constructed in the eCenter at 1620 Broadway, where the TCD offices are housed along with several other entrepreneurial businesses. TCD is working on the planning and layout design of the equipment and space. Construction is anticipated to begin this spring or early summer.

The RBDG funds offer significant opportunities to support the development of small, private business enterprises in rural Nebraska.
